WILLIAM STEPHEN BELICHICK was born on the glorious day of April 16th, 1952. William "Bill" Belichick is a legendary American football coach who is currently the head football coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Many Coach Bill Belichick fans have begun calling the University, "University of North Carolina at Chapel Bill."

Coach Bill Belichick is widely regarded as one of the best head football coaches in the history of professional football. As the self-proclaimed "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", I can confirm that Coach Bill Belichick holds many coaching records, including the mind-blowing record of having won the most Super Bowl wins (six) as a head coach. Coach Bill Belichick won all of his Super Bowls while serving as the head coach of The New England Patriots. Coach Bill Belichick also won two additional Super Bowls while serving as the defensive coordinator for

the New York Giants during a time when they were known for having an amazing defense. Coach Bill Belichick owns the record for eight combined total Super Bowl victories as coach and coordinator. Coach Bill Belichick is known as a legendary football historian, and is referred to by many as the ultimate "student of the game." Coach Bill Belichick has a vast and ever expanding deep knowledge of the nuances of the game and the intricacies of each player's position on the football field. During Coach Bill Belichick's career with the New England Patriots, Coach Bill Belichick was the leading personality, figure, manager, and leader. He served as both the head coach and what most called the "de facto" general manager during the years of the New England Dynasty, which spanned nearly two decades from 2001 to 2019. As "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", it is hard for me to not cry while typing this.

1975 - Coach Bill Belichick graduated from college in 1975 from Wesleyan University, where Coach Bill Belichick played both lacrosse and football. When not investing his time becoming the best football coach in the history of professional football, Coach Bill Belichick found the time to co-create three children Amanda, Stephen and Brian with his now ex-wife, Debby Clarke Belichick.

COACH BILL BELICHICK CAREER QUICK SUMMARY:

1975 - During the year of 1975, Coach Bill Belichick began his epic coaching career, all while working as an assistant for the Baltimore Colts. All before he ultimately became

the defensive coordinator for the New York Giants in 1985 where he won two Super Bowls under the leadership of head coach, Bill Parcells. Coach Bill Belichick was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns during the year of 1991 where he led the Cleveland team for five football seasons. Coach Bill Belichick also coached with the New England Patriots and the New York Jets before becoming the head coach of The New England Patriots in 2000.

COACH BILL BELICHICK CAREER TIMELINE:

1952 - Coach Bill Belichick was birthed on Earth in Nashville, Tennessee, on April 16, 1952 as the son of Jeannette (née Munn) and Steve Belichick. Although Coach Bill Belichick went on to become God's Gift to football, contrary to popular belief I do believe no immaculate conception was involved in the creation of Coach Bill Belichick. As the self-proclaimed "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", I believe that all should know that Coach Bill Belichick was named after College Football Hall of Fame coach Bill Edwards, who was also Coach Bill Belichick's godfather.

Coach Bill Belichick is of Croatian ancestry, his paternal grandparents, Marija Barković and Ivan Biličić, immigrated from Draganić in 1897 and settled in Monessen, Pennsylvania. This is where they changed their names to Mary and John Belichick at the suggestion of immigration officers. Unfortunately, despite my desire to make things right, Croatia has still not yet changed their name to "Belichick" in honor of Coach Bill Belichick.

BILL BELICHICK

Coach Bill Belichick was raised in Annapolis, Maryland, where he was directly mentored by another legendary football coach and father. Steve Belichick. Coach Bill Belichick's father. Steve Belichick was an assistant football coach at the United States Naval Academy. Coach Bill Belichick has communicated that his father was perhaps the most important football mentor in his life. Coach Bill Belichick would consistently study football with his father, Steve Belichick. Coach Bill Belichick reportedly was taught how to break down game film at a very young age as a result of watching his father, Steve Belichick as he would diligently do his job while working as a football coach at Navy. Most Americans and American football fans do not know this, but Coach Bill Belichick's father. Steve Coach Bill Belichick wrote the most profound book in the history of football, "Football Scouting Methods," a book that Coach Bill Belichick cites as highly influential in his development as a coach.

The man who would go on to become the legendary NFL coach, Coach Bill Belichick graduated from Annapolis High School during the year 1970 where he would be a classmate of "the" Sally Brice-O'Hara. Sally Brice-O'Hara would go on to become the Vice Commandant of the Coast Guard.

While at Annapolis High School, Coach Bill Belichick played both football and lacrosse, with football being his favorite sport. Coach Bill Belichick then enrolled at Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts, for a postgraduate year, with the goal of raising and improving

his grades and test scores so he could be admitted to a higher quality college. Although I personally believe that The Phillips Academy might want to consider renaming themselves to be The Belichick Academy of Andover, The Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts later honored Coach Bill Belichick 40 years later by inducting him into its Athletics Hall of Honor in 2011, while deciding to not rename the school as The Belichick Academy of Andover.

Coach Bill Belichick then attended Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut, where he played both center and tight end. In addition to becoming a member of the football team, Coach Bill Belichick played lacrosse and a racquet-based game called squash, all while serving as the captain of the lacrosse team during his senior season. You might be asking, what is squash? Squash, which is often called squash rackets, is a racket sport played by two (singles) or four players (doubles) in a four-walled court with a small, hollow, rubber ball. The players then alternate in striking the ball with their rackets onto the playable surfaces of the four walls of the court.

Coach Bill Belichick became a member of Chi Psi fraternity en route to earning a bachelor's degree in economics in 1975. Coach Bill Belichick eventually was part of the inaugural induction class into the University's Athletics Hall of Fame in spring of 2008.

Before graduating from Wesleyan University in 1975, Coach Bill Belichick was reportedly known as nearly the exact polar opposite of his current reserved coaching and

leadership persona. Coach Bill Belichick's Classmates recall that as president of the Chi Psi fraternity, the son of Navy's football scout and future NFL Hall of Famer, Coach Bill Belichick could usually be found in the vicinity of frat guys peeing on rival houses and blasting soda machines with a shotgun. Some speculate, but it cannot be proven that Coach Bill Belichick inspired Will Ferrall's "old School" character.

1975 - After graduating from Wesleyan University, Coach Bill Belichick took a \$25 per week job as an assistant for the Baltimore Colts head coach Ted Marchibroda. In 1976, Coach Bill Belichick then joined the Detroit Lions as their assistant special teams coach before being asked to also add the tight ends and wide receivers coaching duties to his responsibilities list in 1977. Unfortunately, the team failed to recognize the greatness of the young Coach Bill Belichick, Coach Bill Belichick was dismissed with head coach Tommy Hudspeth and the rest of the coaching staff on January 9, 1978, a day that will forever be remembered as "The Day of Infamy". Coach Bill Belichick then invested the 1978 season working with the Denver Broncos as their assistant special teams coach and defensive assistant while also working on the team as director of films. Obsessed with football and becoming the best coach he could possibly be, Coach Bill Belichick was building himself into the ultimate National Football League coach one job at a time.

Since the time he started his legendary NFL coaching career, Coach Bill Belichick has been called several different

nicknames. During Coach Bill Belichick's stints in Detroit and Denver led to the nicknames such as "Boy Genius" and "Punk." While working in New York for the New York Giants under Coach Bill Parcells, Coach Parcells called Coach Bill Belichick "Doom and Gloom" for his aloof demeanor. As "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan" I would suggest that Coach Bill Parcells should refer to Coach Bill Belichick as "The Master," "The Wise One," "The Yoda of Coaching" and "The Best Coach In the World Ever."

1976 – The future NFL legend, Coach Bill Belichick joined the Detroit Lions as an assistant special teams coach. He was fired along with the rest of Tommy Hudspeth's coaching staff at the end of the 1977 season.

1979 – After one year with the Denver Broncos, Coach Bill Belichick began a 12-year career with the New York Giants, joining the team as a New York Giants special teams coach where he first worked as an assistant football coach under Ray Perkins. Coach Bill Belichick then helped to guide the legendary New York Giants defense while serving under the iconic football coach, Coach Bill Parcells. Together Coach Bill Parcells and Coach Bill Belichick lead the Giants to win two Super Bowls. During his time coaching the New York Giants, Coach Bill Belichick added linebacker coaching to his duties in 1980. He was named defensive coordinator in 1985 under head coach Bill Parcells, who had replaced Perkins in 1983. After expanding Coach Bill Belichick's duties, the Giants won Super Bowl XXI and Super Bowl XXV following the 1986 and 1990 seasons.

Coach Bill Belichick's legendary defensive game plan from the New York Giants' 20–19 upset victory of the Buffalo Bills in Super Bowl XXV has been placed in the Pro Football Hall of Fame, where it will stand forever as a mind-expanding coaching example for future aspiring NFL coaches. As "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", I would suggest you and your family consider planning a family vacation to visit the NFL Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio so that you and your family can be educated about the legendary New York Giants' 20–19 upset victory of the Buffalo Bills in Super Bowl XXV.

1991 – At age 38, Coach Bill Belichick was hired as the head coach of the (original) Cleveland Browns making him the league's youngest head coach by six years. As the head coach of an NFL team for the first time, Coach Bill Belichick showcased his beautiful and perfectly stoic personality and commanding leadership skills that he would become known for during his time in New England. The Browns went 11-5 and reached the second round of the playoffs in 1994, however, during the 1995 season owner Art Modell announced his decision to move the NFL team to Baltimore, Maryland. The Browns, 4-5 at the time, finished 5-11 and then the Browns made one of the biggest mistakes in the history of professional football, they fired the football legend, Coach Bill Belichick. Despite having been given assurances that he would coach the new team that would later become the Baltimore Ravens, Coach Bill Belichick was instead fired on February 14, 1996, a day that will forever chill the bones of Cleveland Browns fans.

When Coach Bill Belichick cut Cleveland's popular quarterback, Bernie Kosas from their roster, Coach Bill Belichick was so hated in Cleveland, he began to receive death threats from Bernie Kosar loyalists and local broadcaster Casey Coleman received death threats as well because he unapologetically supported Coach Bill Belichick's decision. Both men got FBI protection until the death threats stopped. As "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", I believe that the FBI should consider renaming themselves as "For Belichick Individuals" to improve the amount of respect that they are given in the current political climate.

During Coach Bill Belichick's time as the head coach of the Cleveland Browns, coincidentally, Coach Bill Belichick's lone playoff victory was achieved against the New England Patriots, who were coached by former Giants head coach Bill Parcells, in the Wild Card Round during that postseason. During Coach Bill Belichick's final season in Cleveland, the Browns finished 5—11 despite starting 3—1. One of Coach Bill Belichick's most controversial moves was his decision to cut quarterback Bernie Kosar midway through the 1993 season. Bernie Kosar was signed by the Dallas Cowboys two days later and won a Super Bowl with the Cowboys in Super Bowl XXVIII as a backup.

In the 2013 episode of A Football Life on the Cleveland Browns relocation controversy, many sports journalists who obsessively researched and covered the Browns at the time said that in retrospective, Coach Bill Belichick actually laid the groundwork for the Ravens success in the ensuing

decades. This included their win in Super Bowl XXXV (with Cleveland holdovers Matt Stover and Rob Burnett still with the team at that point), setting up the infrastructure by giving recently retired tight end Ozzie Newsome his first front-office job and had planned on drafting Ray Lewis in the 1996 NFL Draft if Belichick and the team stayed in Cleveland. If it were possible, as "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", I would like to credit Coach Bill Belichick as being the reason for the success of the Baltimore Ravens, the New England Patriots, the National Football League & America!

In fact, the newly-named Baltimore Ravens did draft Lewis, who went on to have a legendary 17-year Hall of Fame career with the team.

1996 SEASON - Coach Bill Belichick was reunited with his football mentor, Coach Bill Parcells, who was now the head coach in New England. The New England Patriots reached the Super Bowl that season; Coach Bill Belichick was reported to have softened personally, including cultivating a relationship with team owner Robert Kraft.

Coach Bill Belichick served under Coach Bill Parcells again as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach with the New England Patriots for the 1996 season. The Patriots finished with an 11–5 record and won the AFC Championship over the Jacksonville Jaguars, but then lost to the Green Bay Packers in Super Bowl XXXI amid rumors of Coach Bill Parcells's impending defection. Some have speculated (mostly me), that if Coach Bill Belichick would have been allowed to be the head coach during the Super

Bowl versus the Green Packers, the New England Patriots would have won. As "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", these are the things I think about without ceasing.

1997 SEASON — Coach Bill Parcells and Robert Kraft's relationship was not positive and it completely fell apart during the Super Bowl week, and Coach Parcells flew home separate from the team after the loss to Green Bay. Coach Bill Parcells then arrived on a deal that would allow him to take over the New York Jets. Robert Kraft refused to relinquish his rights, leaving Coach Bill Belichick as the head coach briefly. Coach Bill Parcells eventually negotiated his release, restoring Coach Bill Belichick as his top assistant and contractually stipulated heir.

NEW YORK JETS (1997-1999)

Unbeknownst to most people and most Coach Bill Belichick fans, Coach Bill Belichick had two stints as the head coach of the New York Jets without ever actually coaching an NFL game.

In February 1997, Belichick, who had been an excellent and standout assistant coach under Bill Parcells with the New York Giants and New England Patriots, was named the Jets interim head coach while the Jets and Patriots continued to negotiate compensation to release Coach Bill Parcells from his contract with the New England Patriots which would then allow Coach Bill Parcells to coach the Jets. Just six days later, the New England Patriots and the

New York Jets reached an agreement that allowed Parcells to coach the New York Jets, and Coach Bill Belichick simultaneously became the team's assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

When Coach Bill Parcells decided to step down and no longer be the head coach of the New York Jets, after the 1999 season, he had already arranged with team management to have Coach Bill Belichick succeed him. However, Coach Bill Belichick was only the New York Jets' head football coach for just a day. On January 4, 2000, after Coach Bill Belichick was announced as the new head coach of the New York Jets, he turned his first press conference into a surprise resignation announcement. Just moments before walking up to the podium, Coach Bill Belichick wrote down a resignation note on a napkin that read, in its entirety, "I resign as HC of the NYJ." He then proceeded to deliver a half-hour speech explaining his resignation to the members of the media, that had assembled to meet the new head coach of the New York Jets.

TOM BRADY TAKES OVER AS THE QUARTERBACK FOR THE NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS

Tom Brady remained the starter for the rest of the National Football League season and New England made a run to the Super Bowl where they actually upset St. Louis Rams' and what was called at the time, the "Greatest Show on Turf." This was the first Super Bowl win in the history of the New England Patriots' franchise.

2003 SEASON — During the 2003 season the Patriots won the Super Bowl for a second time in three seasons under Coach Bill Belichick's leadership. The Patriots won the Super Bowl that year, in a 32-29 victory over Carolina Panthers in Super Bowl 38, which was held at Reliant Stadium in Houston, Texas.

It has been reported that Coach Bill Belichick was not excited about becoming the head coach of the New York Jets, because the New York Jets appeared to be reluctantly promoting Coach Bill Belichick to become their next head coach. As stated above, after just one day on the job, Coach Bill Belichick resigned from the position and moved to become the legendary, iconic and epic New England Patriots head coach the following year. As a man who is often referred to as "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan" I believe that the New York Jets should have considered renaming their team, The New York Coach Bill Belichick's in order to keep the coaching legend, Coach Bill Belichick as their head coach. The executives leading The New York Jets should have even considered shaving their heads and getting Coach Bill Belichick's name tattooed on top of their heads to demonstrate their appreciation and commitment to Coach Bill Belichick.

Soon after this bizarre turn of events, Belichick was introduced as the 12th full-time head coach of the New England Patriots officially succeeding Coach Pete Carroll who had recently been fired. The Patriots had inquired to the New York Jets about getting permission to interview Coach Bill Belichick for their vacant spot at head coach just

prior to Coach Bill Parcells deciding to step down. Coach Bill Parcells and the New York Jets stated that Coach Bill Belichick was still under contract to the New York Jets and thus, they demanded compensation from the New England Patriots. The NFL Commissioner at the time, Paul Tagliabue agreed, and the New England Patriots gave the New York Jets a first-round draft pick in 2000 in exchange for the right to hire the future coaching legend, Coach Bill Belichick.

April 2000 — In April of 2000, the New England Patriots selected former Michigan quarterback Tom Brady 199th overall in the sixth round of the NFL draft. Coach Bill Belichick listed him on his roster as the Patriots' fourth quarterback with Tom Brady only actually appearing in one game during the entirety of his rookie season. The New England Patriots finished the season with a 5 win and 11 loss record under Coach Bill Belichick's leadership. As "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan", I should make it known that Coach Bill Belichick himself chose not to actually play during any of the games during this season. Some have speculated that Coach Bill Belichick inserted himself into the starting lineup on both the offensive and defensive sides of the ball.

When Coach Bill Belichick arrived at The New England Patriots in 2000, the Patriots had just finished their season 8-8 under the leadership of Pete Carroll. When Coach Bill Belichick arrived in Foxborough, Massachusetts he intended to completely overhaul the roster and to build a team capable of creating the winning culture that Coach

Bill Belichick had envisioned. When Coach Bill Belichick started his reign as the head coach of the New England Patriots he had several compensatory draft picks available which were earned by Peter Carroll in 1999, when Coach Peter Carroll decided to let many veterans leave the team during the free agency period because of salary cap concerns. Thus, The Patriots had earned two compensatory sixth-round picks in the 2000 draft, which were likely as a result of the departures of defenders Mark Wheeler and Todd Collins, both of which were no longer in the NFL at the end of the 2000 season.

Demonstrating yet again his coaching genius, Coach Bill Belichick decided to use one of those compensatory sixth-round picks to draft a quarterback. The New England Patriots had debated back and forth about drafting Louisiana Tech's Tim Rattay or Michigan's Tom Brady. However, it has been reported the quarterbacks coach, Dick Rehbein, was allowed to cast the deciding vote in the draft room, and thus the team made the decision to draft Tom Brady! Tim Rattay went on to start 18 games for the San Francisco 49ers and Tom Brady eventually would become the most accomplished, celebrated and successful player in the history of The National Football League.

2001 SEASON — During the 2001 season, Coach Bill Belichick decided to promote Tom Brady to become Drew Bledsoe's backup. However, during Week 2 of the season, Coach Bill Belichick inserted Tom Brady into the game against the New York Jets because Drew Bledsoe suffered a concussion and a collapsed lung after receiving

a devastating hit late in the fourth quarter of a 10-3 loss. Although Drew Bledsoe was a highly paid fan favorite, Coach Bill Belichick saw the potential of a young Tom Brady.

COACH BILL BELICHICK HAS A YODA-LEVEL INFLUENCE IN HIS COACHING LIFE

2006 SEASON — The New England Patriots set an NFL record with 10 consecutive postseason victories by beating the Jacksonville Jaguars 28-3. The New England Patriots milestone surpassed the nine straight playoff victories record previously set by the Green Bay Packers in the 196'os. As a man who is considered by myself and several others as "Coach Bill Belichick's number one fan" this section of the book and the detailed documenting of

Coach Bill Belichick's success pushes me to the verge of tears. However, we must continue on as we fight back the tears.

COACH BILL BELICHICK'S SON IS A PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL COACH

Stephen C. Belichick was born on March 25, 1987 and is an American college football coach who is the defensive coordinator for the University of Washington, a position he has held since 2024. However, Stephen Belichick is expected to rejoin his father (Coach Bill Belichick) in 2025 as Defensive Coordinator for the North Carolina football team following the 2024 New Year's Eve Sun Bowl versus Louisville. 2009 - The 2009 season for the New England Patriots was their 50th season overall and their 10th season under the leadership of Coach Bill Belichick. They finished the season with a solid record of 10–6, all while earning a division title before losing to the Baltimore Ravens during the NFL playoffs. It is worth mentioning that Coach Bill Belichick was not playing quarterback during the team's loss to the Baltimore Ravens.

COACH BILL BELICHICK'S DAUGHTER AMANDA BELICHICK IS A WOMEN'S LACROSSE HEAD COACH

Amanda Belichick has been a head coach at Holy Cross working as the head coach for the women's lacrosse program. Amanda is Coach Bill Belichick's eldest child and only daughter. Amanda Belichick was born in 1984 and she graduated in 2007 from Wesleyan University, where she earned a degree in history. Amanda was a lacrosse coach at her alma mater before being named the head coach of the women's lacrosse team at the College of the Holy Cross in 2015.

2010 - The 2010 season for the New England Patriots' was their 51st season as a franchise overall. Coach Bill Belichick led the Patriots where they improved on their 10–6 record from the 2009 season by finishing the year with a leaguebest 14–2 record which allowed them to clinch the top

seed in the AFC, before losing to the New York Jets in the playoffs. It should be noted that Coach Bill Belichick was not playing quarterback during the team's loss to the New York Jets.

Unknown to most, Coach Bill Belichick created the Coach Bill Belichick Foundation in 2013 with the goal of

providing financial support to individuals, communities and organizations focused on football and lacrosse.

2014 SEASON - During the season of 2014, The New England Patriots finished their third straight regular season with 12 wins and they earned their sixth trip to the Super Bowl under the consistent and diligent leadership of the hooded one, Coach Bill Belichick. This game ended in very dramatic fashion when the undrafted rookie by the name of Malcomb Butler was able to intercept the Seattle Seahawks and their quarterback Russell Wilson's short pass into the endzone. 2024 - NORTH CAROLINA TAR HEELS (2025-PRESENT)

On the glorious day of December 11, 2024, Coach Bill Belichick was named the 35th head football coach of the North Carolina Tar Heels football team. As the head coach of the North Carolina Tar Heels football team, this will be Coach Bill Belichick's first time coaching football on the

2004: CB RANDALL GAY

After a strong collegiate career at LSU, Gay went undrafted in the 2004 NFL Draft. The Patriots scooped him up and he immediately had an impact on the team's secondary, emerging as a starter while recording 34 tackles, 2 interceptions, and 6 passes defensed for the

squad. He led the team in tackles during their Super Bowl 39 victory with 11. He played four seasons with the Patriots as a nickel back during the middle of his tenure and was solid, even though the team had multiple injuries to key players during that time.

2009: OB BRIAN HOYER

Hoyer emerged as the Patriots' top backup quarterback during his rookie preseason, beating out former third-round pick Kevin O'Connell, veteran Kevin Walter, and Matt Gutierrez for the job. He spent three years with the Patriots before bouncing around the league as a spot starter, logging a 16-21 record with 48 passing touchdowns and 30 interceptions. He returned to the Patriots as a backup quarterback as part of the Jimmy Garoppolo trade in 2017.

2012: RB BRANDON BOLDEN,

Bolden quickly emerged as a special teams contributor for the Patriots while averaging 4.2 yards per carry and 7.9 yards per reception during his six years with the team. He had a brief, one-year stop in Miami but returned to the team during the 2019 offseason.

2014: CB MALCOLM BUTLER

Butler is the best undrafted free agent on this list. He first made waves with his game-clinching interception of Russell Wilson in Super Bowl 49 in which he jumped Ricardo Lockette's run in the slot on the goal line. From there, he developed into the Patriots' top cornerback. Over the next three years, Butler started 47 games, intercepted

eight passes, created four fumbles, broke up 44 passes, and logged 159 tackles. His final moment with the Patriots — playing just one snap in the team's Super Bowl 52 loss to the Philadelphia Eagles — was certainly confounding, but he has continued to be a strong NFL cornerback since joining the Tennessee Titans in the 2018 offseason.

2015: C DAVID ANDREWS

Andrews quickly became the Patriots' starter at center after signing with the Patriots out of Georgia. He started and was a big asset for Tom Brady in pass protection while making line calls.

2016: DB JONATHAN JONES

After a very strong career at Auburn, Jones went undrafted in the 2016 draft and signed with the Patriots. He performed well enough in the preseason to earn a job and was a key role player for the team in recent seasons. He played in every game since 2016 and logged a career-high three interceptions, 1.5 sacks, and 56 tackles in 2018.

2017: TE JACOB HOLLISTER

Hollister appeared in 15 games as a rookie for the Patriots, but he only played in 7.5 percent of the offensive snaps. He had more of an impact on special teams. He was traded to the Seattle Seahawks during the 2019 offseason.

2018: CB J.C. JACKSON

Jackson had a terrific preseason with the Patriots and earned a spot on the 53-man roster as their lone undrafted

free agent in 2018. He was a key part of the Patriots' secondary rotation during his rookie season and showed off nice ball skills, grabbing three interceptions and six pass defenses in 13 games (five starts). He has the tools needed to be a quality starter and his performance was part of the reason that the team felt comfortable moving on from 2018 second-round pick Duke Dawson just ahead of 2019 roster cuts.

2019: WR GUNNER OLSZEWSKI, WR JAKOBI MEYERS

Perhaps one of the most unlikely success stories of this list is Olszewski who went undrafted out of Division II Bemidji State and got a call from the Patriots for a workout while he was digging a ditch. The Patriots converted him to wide receiver and he showed enough as a return man to make the roster despite being told earlier that he would be waived. The Patriots didn't want to risk losing him on waivers, so they decided to trade DB Keion Crossen to open up a roster spot for Olszewski.

Meanwhile, Meyers, had an excellent preseason for the Patriots and emerged quickly as a potential contributor. He caught 20 passes for 253 yards and two scores in the preseason and while he'll likely be a depth player to start his career, he showed a lot of future upside.

Move #1—Resigning from the Jets the day after becoming their head coach, to join the Patriots. He now has a career record of 29-11 against the Jets as the Patriots Head Coach / G.M.

Move #2 – Trading a 6th round draft pick for Kyle Van Noy and a 7th round pick. Van Noy was a former 2nd round draft pick by the Lions, but didn't quite pan out the way they had hoped. Since the trade, he's become one of the Patriots best defensive players, and it showed in the 2019 post season.

Move #3 – Signing Darrelle Revis to what turned out to be a 1 year contract for 12 million dollars with a 2nd year option for an additional \$20 million. Although the option didn't get picked up after his 1 year stint with New England, Revis was a big part in helping the Patriots get to and win the Super Bowl.

Move #4—Signing Stephon Gilmore to a 5 year \$65 million contract. At the time, many thought it was a strange deal, and one that the Patriots usually wouldn't hand out to a player. However, Gilmore earned every penny from that contract, coming up big for the Patriots.

Move #5 – Trading a 2nd and 7th round draft pick for Wes Welker. In his 6th season with the Patriots, Welker caught 672 passes, was a first down machine, and helped redefine the slot receiver role for the New England Patriots.

Move #6 — Drafting former Kent State quarterback Julian Edelman in the 7th round (pick 232). Belichick told Edelman after selecting him in the 2009 NFL draft: "We don't know what position you're going to play, but we know you can play ball." Edelman worked extremely hard to become a receiver in the NFL. His hard work has paid off and he won his 3rd Super Bowl and 1st Super Bowl MVP, catching 10 passes for 141 yards in the Patriots Super Bowl 53 win against the Rams.

Move #7 – Trading a 4th round draft pick to the Raiders for Randy Moss. Many thought Moss' career was over and that he was washed up, but many were wrong! Moss had his best season statistically in his first year with the Patriots in 2007, catching a record 23 touchdowns and helping the Patriots get to a 16-0 season. The Patriots ultimately came up short against the Giants in the Super Bowl, missing out on a perfect season.

before taking a scary hit that almost ended his career. The Bills traded a 1st round draft pick to their division rival for a QB entering his 10th season and Bledsoe only lasted 3 seasons in Buffalo.

Move #10 – Drafting Wisconsin running back James White from Wisconsin during the fourth round of the NFL draft. His receiving statistics exceeded his rushing statistics. He is one of two holders (the other being Darren Sproles) of the all-time record for receptions in a single playoff game, 15, which he made in the AFC divisional round playoff game following the 2018 season.

In 2011, after successfully coaching one of the most successful offensive games in the history of professional football, Coach Bill Belichick found room for himself and his team to improve.

Although quarterback Tom Brady threw for a mindblowing 517 yards and the Patriots offense earned 622 yards in a Monday night 38-24 victory over the Miami Dolphins, Coach Bill Belichick was still looking for areas in which his offense could improve.

In fact during the Tuesday press conference that followed the game, Coach Bill Belichick said the following: "We had the ball on the 1-yard line ready to score a touchdown and we end up getting knocked out of field goal range and couldn't get a field goal before the half."

Coach Bill Belichick also took the time to share that he was not in favor of the way the game ended either.

Coach Bill Belichick stated, "We really weren't able to close out the game. At the end of the game there were a couple of first downs that we couldn't make. The good thing was, offensively, whenever Miami scored or started to change the momentum of the game a little bit, our offense was able to come back and drive the ball and score points and change that momentum around, so that was great."

Throughout the game, Tom Brady largely led the team with a no-huddle offense, which prevented the Miami Dolphins from being able to make the player substitutions that they wanted to make.

Coach Belichick commented during Tuesday's press conference following the Monday night victory, "It's great that we could take advantage of it, but those opportunities won't always be there...I'm sure as teams get more experienced with their communication and get further into the season, you'll see less and less of that...We're just trying to keep ironing out all the little details and that's really across the board. It's offense, defense, special teams. There are always things on every play, even good plays, that a lot of times aren't done quite properly and had the (opposing) defense or the offense been in (a) different play or done things a little bit differently, then we would have had a problem."

During this incredible offensive performance by Coach Bill Belichick's Patriots, Tom Brady threw four touchdowns, two of which went to Wes Welker, and tight ends, Aaron Hernandez and Rob Gronkowski.

A man by the name of Phil Savage had the pleasure of working for the legend, Coach Bill Belichick while Coach Bill Belichick was serving as the head coach of the Cleveland Browns. Phil Savage who worked for Coach Bill Belichick from 1993 to 1993 invested the time to share what it was like to actually watch game film with Coach Bill Belichick with ESPN Magazine:

"My film breakdowns weren't what he wanted. So he says, 'Let's just sit down and go through a few plays together.' We're getting ready for Tampa, he throws the first play up on the screen and starts going, from the inside out, over every single tiny detail. 'See this split of the linemen? That's 2 feet. That's 3 feet. That one's 2 feet between the center and the guard. Write that down. OK, now look at the splits of the wide receivers. The Z is inside the numbers. The X is outside. OK, the quarterback. Look! Right there! He looks to the left, to the right, to the left, then to the middle and then he hikes the ball. You gotta monitor that because it could help our defensive linemen get a jump on the snap."

"He proceeds to go through all these little intricacies on the game film ... and it's 20 minutes on one play. Twenty minutes! In my immature mind I'm sitting there in the dark doing the math: Three games to break down on each

side of the ball, 60 plays in each game, 20 minutes a play means I can get through three plays in an hour. My god, I'll never sleep again. And I didn't."

Coach Bill Belichick has described his approach to watching NFL game film: "You can really get to everything, between the different angles, the TV copy, and so many different ways to look at plays...Before, when I came into the league, you had the film. You had one, kind of look at it. If you want to cut out plays, like short yardage, third down, or something like that, you could do that. It was a little bit of trouble, but you could do it...The concept now of looking at...it's really limitless the way you can put all that together and how quickly it can come together, so it gives you a lot of options...You can get caught in the weeds with so many little details and all that...I think you've just got to be careful that you don't miss the big picture. It does provide for some very detailed analysis.

If you want to watch a specific type of player against another specific type of player, if you want to watch a certain tackle against two or three speed rushers on pass plays, you can pull those plays in ten seconds. That would ve taken a month to do when I first came into the league... With a larger staff, we kind of divide that up so we can get into it a little bit deeper look, a deeper dive into some of that. Again, the archives that you can keep are pretty

amazing as well. If you want to look at all the reverses in the last 10 years, they'll be ready for you in a very short amount of time. It's a great resource and figuring out the best way to manage it, use it, is really the challenge."

In past years, college athletes were also very limited when it came to transferring to other college programs throughout their collegiate playing career. However, players can now freely transfer to other teams due to the creation of the transfer portal window which was reduced in October of 2024 to 30 days for Division I basketball and football players. Because of these rule changes and other dynamics, college coaches must now learn how to keep their players happy, while coaching them, recruiting outside talent, and retaining the talent they want to keep. In fact, one could argue that the free agency of college athletes is more free than that of professional athletes in 2025.

direction, which eventually all athletes do—you can't play forever—then they'll be trained to go into life and their chosen profession, and learn the things about leadership, discipline and structure they need to be productive."

Fan favorites in New England such as Terry Glenn & Drew Bledsoe were traded away because Coach Bill Belichick did not believe that they offered the team the best chance to win. In fact, during the 2003 season, Coach Bill Belichick decided to cut the long-time New England Patriots and seven-year veteran Lawyer Milloy at the very end of the team's training camp. At the time, ESPN commentator and analyst Tom Jackson reported that the Patriots team, "hate their coach." However, over time fans, players and the members of The Patriots organization began to accept and understand that constantly evolving the roster was going to be Coach Bill Belichick's normal. Having been self-employed for 28 years, I know that this is exactly like running a business. In a league that is designed to not create sustainable dynasties, Coach Bill Belichick just keeps on winning. 

Belichick stayed with the Giants for 12 seasons. He eventually took over as the team's defensive coordinator under the legendary, Bill Parcells. Together, they coached the team to two Super Bowl victories.

"Mental toughness is doing the right thing for the team when it's not the best thing for you."



FUN FACTS

Once the Giants had won their second Super Bowl, other NFL teams began to pursue Coach Bill Belichick to become their head coach. The Cleveland Browns owner, Art Modell, reached out to Belichick and eventually hired him to be their new head coach. During Bill's time in Cleveland, things were not good. He was very demanding of his players and he had little support from the upper management. His interviews with the local media did not help his case either. The combination of perpetually losing and not being loved by the media ultimately cost him his job. After the 1995 season, Art Modell announced that he was moving the franchise to Baltimore and that Coach Bill Belichick was fired. The management never gave Bill the control over the team and he was never able to win over the full support of the management.

HOW TO APPLY THIS PRINCIPLE IN YOUR BUSINESS

To win in business, you must win with The 3 Ps: a PRODUCT or SERVICE that your customers love, PROFITS that feed your family, and quality PEOPLE who you enjoy working with.

FUN FACT

"Employers, be prepared for alarm as you review the newest statistical breakdown: 31% of employees waste roughly 30 minutes daily. 31% of employees waste roughly 1 hour daily. 16% of employees waste roughly 2 hours daily. 6% of employees waste roughly 3 hours daily. 2% of employees waste roughly 4 hours daily. 2% of employees waste 5 or more hours daily."

EA Sports, which produces the Madden series of NFL games, has a licensing contract with the NFL Coaches Association. It pays the NFLCA for the use of the coaches' likeness or name. After being fired, he was able to find work quickly with his mentor, Bill Parcells. Parcells was the head coach of the New England Patriots at the time. Bill and Bill coached together in New England for the 1996 season and during that same year, the New England Patriots made it to the Super Bowl, where they ultimately lost to the Green Bay Packers. The year after their Super Bowl appearance, Belichick was invited to follow Parcells to the New York Jets, where Parcells had been hired as the new head coach.

HOW TO APPLY THIS PRINCIPLE IN YOUR BUSINESS

As a manager, you must make sure that you and your team are focused on winning. Don't focus on looking good on Facebook, Linkedin, Youtube, Twitter, and other social media platforms because they will not produce results for your company during the work day.



As a manager and business owner, you must set high expectations for your team that are far higher than the expectations of your customers (fans). When you do that, you will win.



Adam Vinatieri - He's the best field goal kicker of his generation and he was not drafted after playing his college career at South Dakota State.

Lonie Paxton - The long-snapper was undrafted in 2000 and yet was signed by the Patriots. He was important during many key moments.

Wes Welker - After having a good career at Texas Tech, he was not drafted. The Chargers signed him, but he was cut. He then played for the Dolphins for two years before joining the Patriots in 2007.

BenJarvus Green-Ellis - The Patriot with the super-long name played college at Ole Miss and went undrafted in 2008. He was signed by the Patriots and was a backup for many running backs until injuries created an opportunity for Green-Ellis to showcase his talents.



FUN FACT

Tom Brady was drafted by the Patriots in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL draft. He initially found himself as the team's fourth quarterback on the depth chart and as a player fighting for a roster spot. As a result of diligence, he moved up to become the Patriots' backup quarterback. Unfortunately, he only played one game during his first NFL season. During the 2001 season, the team's starting All-Pro quarterback, Drew Bledsoe, was injured and Brady quickly proved himself to be the perfect man for the job. He lead the team to 11 wins and 3 losses during the 14 games he played. In the post-season, he lead the team to a win over the St. Louis Rams during Super Bowl XXXVI. He was named the Most Valuable Player of the Super Bowl.

HOW TO APPLY THIS PRINCIPLE IN YOUR BUSINESS

As a manager, you must surround yourself with consistent performers who don't have massive emotional ups and downs or you will have a dramatic office environment filled with turmoil. You must develop a bias for consistent and diligent performers.

"To live in the past is to die in the present."



"This won't be good enough. It wasn't good enough today. It won't be good enough against anybody else, either."



The team also needed a third member of the secondary. Belichick elected to use the team's star receiver, Troy Brown, to fill in as the slot cornerback. Brown made a huge impact for the team while in this position. He even made an interception from his former quarterback, Drew Bledsoe.

HOW TO APPLY THIS PRINCIPLE IN YOUR BUSINESS

As a manager, you must be candid with your team about where they stand, and how well or poor they are performing on the job. Whatever you accept, you must expect. Set high expectations and push your team to perform at a high level and you will win.



Coach Bill Belichick is committed to winning year after year and to making the tough calls that other NFL coaches or managers wouldn't be willing to do. After winning the Superbowl, Bill decided to release the team's captain, Lawyer Milloy. At the time of the cut. Belichick commented that had been the hardest release he'd ever had to make. Milloy was 29 years old, a fan favorite, and the heart and soul of the Patriots locker room. The decision was made on September 2nd, 2003, the morning before New England's scheduled season opener to be played against the Buffalo Bills. The cut shook up members of the team. ESPN and NFL analyst, Tom Jackson, described the Patriots locker room by saying, "they hate their coach." Milloy quickly scored a job with the Buffalo Bills and he played a key role in the Buffalo's 31-0 win over New England. However, as the year went on, Belichick was once again proven to be right. The Patriots' new pickup Pro Bowl safety, Rodney Harrison, proved to be able to produce the same results on the field as Milloy but at much less of a cost.

HOW TO APPLY THIS PRINCIPLE IN YOUR BUSINESS

Push your team harder when you are coaching and training them than your customers will push them. You must have higher internal standards and expectations for your team than your customers will have for them.



CHAPTER SIXTEEN

BUILD A VERSATILE TEAM

FUN FACT

Coach Bill Belichick is one of the few head coaches in the NFL who has gone without coordinators. Belichick prefers to keep his coaching staff very small, and has chosen to go without offensive or defensive coordinators routinely in the past. As an example, in the year 2000, Belichick decided to go without a defensive coordinator. His defensive staff did include Brian Daboll. Eric Mangini, and Rob Ryan. In 2005, after he lost his offensive coordinator. Charlie Weis. Belichick named the unproven 29-year-old quarterbacks coach, Josh McDaniels, as the Patriots offensive play-caller. It was not until the following season that he named McDaniels as the team's offensive coordinator. When McDaniels left to take the head coaching job in Denver, his replacement, Bill O'Brien, was not named as the team's offensive coordinator until his second season in this role as well.

HOW TO APPLY THIS PRINCIPLE IN YOUR BUSINESS

As a manager, you never want to hire someone who says, "that's not my job." You must build a winning team based upon a culture of people who are willing to do whatever it takes to win and who are willing to learn new job skills everyday.

- Belichick's father, Steve, started out volunteering and then working as the equipment manager for the Detroit Lions to actually playing for the team in 1941.
- 2. After serving in World War II, Belichick began coaching football professionally. He started out as the head football coach and the head basketball coach at Hiram College. He worked as an assistant coach for Vanderbilt University (1949–1952), the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (1953–1955), and then as an assistant coach for the United States Naval Academy for 34 years.
- 3. While in high school Coach Bill Belichick played lacrosse and football, but preferred lacrosse.
- 4. Coach Bill Belichick graduated from Annapolis High School in 1970.
- 5. After graduating from High School, Bill spent one year of his life at the Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts.
- Coach Bill Belichick went to college at Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut.
- Belichick played tight end and center on the Wesleyan football team.
